

Featured Communication Scholar: Prof. Emmanuel K. Ngwainmbi, PhD

Prof Emmanuel K. Ngwainmbi holds a PhD degree in Mass Communication (Howard-1991), an ABD in English (Literature and Arts in 1988-Howard), an MA degree in English (1986), and a BA in English (1984). He is currently the co-Editor-in-Chief of the *Journal of Mass Media and Journalism* and is editing a book on how global media reporting affects local cultures. He has also been appointed to serve as co-editor of a respectable journal on media studies and copy editor for a Bank. These are all pro-bono activities. He has copy-edited short and long documents for 25 years. He has edited and published 14 books. Prominent among these are:

His writings have appeared in specialized academic journals, magazines, and e-newspapers in Mandarin, French, Spanish, Afrikaans, and German languages. He has presented white papers in more than 120 meetings in the US, European, African, and Asian countries. The habits and experiences he acquired during his academic and intellectual journey

have provided him with a better understanding of the needs of university students, faculty, staff, and the entire academic community.

Prof Ngwainmbi has also produced numerous documents on market research. As a 4th degree member and Church Director for a men's Catholic organization with 1.2 million members worldwide, he has, for 10 straight years, been producing articles that are published in *The Lantern*, a monthly newsletter of the Catholic Church.
